#### **Development and Training Days 2025**

#### **Development Days**

The following Development days have been confirmed: Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> May - Town Loch Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> May - Cotswold Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> May - Southlake Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> May - White Rose These will be traditional Development Days, available to the usual cohort of skiers.

#### Invitational 'Talent Spot' Trick/Slalom Days

We have decided to refine the offering this year and propose to run an invitational 'talent spot' day at Rickmansworth and possibly at an additional site this year. This initiative will focus on strong, young skiers who may have the potential to ski for Britain in the future. More details to come.

#### **Invitational Jump Camp**

We shall also offer an invitational jump event to create a cohort of young competitive skiers in the jump event. This will focus primarily on those skiers we have already taught to jump from prior Development Days, and we hope will create a strong bond between those skiers too. More details to come.

#### Youngsters' Intro' Days

We are also proposing one or two intro days for young skiers feeding into clubs. Again, more details to follow as plans are finalised.

#### Under-21 Slalom/SBD3/Coaching/Judging Camp

Finally, we have agreed that we should run a day, for promising under-21(non-team) skiers who have much to offer as both skiers and officials in the future. The idea would be to enhance their skiing and competition preparation whilst also preparing them for SBD3 Driver qualifications alongside coaching and judging qualifications. This might be a one or two day affair and is work in progress.

So, an ambitious programme for 2025 building on 7 years of Development Day experience

#### **Technical Grants**

FoT offers Technical Grants to Clubs seeking to upgrade their technical kit required to run competitions. With technology constantly evolving this can be off putting to competition organisers, whether "commercial" or members clubs. Last year we received four applications for the four available grants. This year have had nine applications for the four grants which is terrific. After reviewing the applications which are all commendable, we have decided to award a £500 grant to all nine.

The nine clubs involved are:

Bluebird Deaf, Denham, Cirencester, Gosfield, Hazelwoods, Wiremill, Town Loch, Thorpe, and Longside Lake.

Their projects include, new digital cameras and transmitters, a boat mounted jump distance display, repairs to a jump to make it competition ready. The FoT grant is at best a contribution towards the cost of these projects but hopefully a welcome one.

#### Squad Training

FoT has organized Squad Training days every year focused on our U21 and Youth Squad skiers. These sessions have allowed our skiers who will be representing Team GB at European and world titled events to spend time training together. This year the European Youth Championships are in mid July and it is proving difficult to find suitable dates for Squad training in advance of this event and outside school time.

So, for this year FoT will give each UK based Squad skier from all categories, five Coaching vouchers that can be used at Hazelwoods, Gosfield, Thorpe, Dams or Oxford. Of course, this enables the skiers to have a little bit of subsidized training at their chosen time.

#### **Backyard Event Support**

There are more Backyard events on the calendar this year with the successful Cotswold Series expanding to six events, Scotland with their usual four and the new four stop London Series.

FoT will provide £300 worth of support for each event in the form of merchandise for prizes, cash for specific items such as new handles for the competitions of a free BBQ for participants.

The Backyard events are providing a great entry into the competition world for club skiers and hopefully many will progress to Ranking List events and National Championships

#### Loan Kit Scheme

The Loan Kit Scheme is now being managed by Cora Coster and Adele Fearn. The arrangements are that a piece of equipment can be borrowed for six months but then must either be returned or purchased. An extension to the loan period can also be requested. Adele and Cora will be available for any kit donations at the 1<sup>st</sup> comp/conference at Hazelwoods over the May Bank Holiday weekend. #### Projected Spend 2025

#### FoT Basic

The FoT Committee, Dush, Stuart and Gavin met recently to discuss activities for 2025. Of course, most activities carry on from Year to Year but our projected spend for 2025 is £62,200. This is only possible because of the war-chest we accumulated during the Covid years, which is reducing every year. With a £62k spend we are forecasting a carryover amount into 2026 of around £16k.
